This **full-time**, **four-year training position** provides an exceptional opportunity to gain advanced clinical experience while simultaneously working towards two prestigious qualifications:

- A Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine (DVetMed) a four-year programme
- The European College of Veterinary Ophthalmologists (ECVO) Diploma a three-year programme

### About the Role

As a resident, you will play a key role in the **Veterinary Ophthalmology Service**, working alongside a highly skilled team in both the **Hospital for Small Animals** and the **Equine Hospital**. Your training will encompass:

- Extensive hands-on clinical experience
